



## **WONDERS OF THE ARCTIC**

The Inuit and their predecessors adapted and thrived for thousands of years in what is arguably the harshest environment on earth. Today, the Arctic is the focus of intense research. Instead of seeking to conquer the north, scientist pioneers are searching for answers to some troubling questions about the impacts of human activities around the world on this fragile and largely uninhabited frontier.

In creating the music score I felt at first that this story of the north needed an expansive sound, but many of its stories are told by a single person. Crafting a voice for the explorers and inhabitants called for a more intimate approach. These are the roots of the grand themes expressed by the full orchestra and the unifying themes on piano and French horn.

## **GOLD FEVER**

Gold Fever explores the lust and allure of gold in the Klondike Gold Rush, comparing its richness to the ancient worshiping culture of the Ashanti people in Ghana. Gold is a liberating element for some, but for others the allure of gold is a curse, its constant pursuit bringing only misery.

Themes of power, wealth, brutality, and struggle, told in different cultures and geographies, posed complex opportunities for the soundtrack. The warmth and reverence of gold in Ghana called for the majesty for an orchestra, but the drive and innovation of the Gold Rush demanded contemporary folk instrumentation.

Bringing guitar into the orchestra and working out an organic arrangement, helped to bring the worlds together. The orchestra with the guitars balance the natural beauty, history, and human struggle in the quest for gold.

# **MYSTERIES OF THE GREAT LAKES**

The visual splendour of the Great Lakes belies a complex and vital ecosystem. These enormous bodies of freshwater have been supporting life for centuries, but industry and development continue to threaten them. While the film's central story deals with preserving the sturgeon population, and discussing the science of healing historical damage, the reverence for the Great Lakes is expressed through personal stories.

A variety of musical styles was needed to support the many storytelling identities. Delicate adagios portraying a Garden of Eden, contrasting strident heavy marches that represent the power of water, helped to separate and define the natural and human-made conflicts.

The end result is a dramatic visual and musical journey through some of the most spectacular scenery in the world.
